Dul ut h Huski es Add Three Jayhawks

(**Dul ut h, MN)** — The Dul uth Huskies announced the signing of three new players from Kansas University. Joining the Huskies for the 2014 campaign are Michael Tinsley, Stephen Villines, and Jon Hander.

M chael Tinsley is a 5-foot-11 inch 1801bs. fresh man catcher out of Menlo Park, CA. He seen significant action as a true fresh man this season, he has played in 28 games and started 13. His average is .370 and has 13 RBIs for the Jayha wks.

Stephen Villines, a 6-foot-1 inch 1501bs. fresh man right hander has emerged as a mainstay in the KU bull pen. He has stepped into the closer role for the Jayha wks, he is sporting an ERA of 1.60 in 33.2 innings and has 5 saves.

Jon Hander, a 6-foot-2 inch 180 lbs. fresh man right hander has seen quality innings for the Jayha wks this season. Starting out in the KU bull pen but has now been moved the mid-week starter role and has done well. He sports a 3.51 ERA in 25.2 innings with a 1-1 record

KU Head Coach Ritch Price had great things to say about the trio "Michael Tinsley is an outstanding offensive player who we expect to hit in the 3 hole next year as a sophomore. He will replace a big hole of former Duluth Huskies alumi Michael Suiter, who we expect to lose in the professional baseball draft in June. He is at hietic, can run, and plays catcher as well as outfield Stephen Villines is currently our closer; his freshman stats are off the charts. He throws strikes from the side armslot, can spin the ball a way from RH Htters, and uses his changeup with fade to LH Htters. Fearless on the mound, he brings California's wagger to his role! John Hander, RHP, is our mid-week starter and is having an outstanding freshman season. Sits 87-90, has a very good CH, and BB. He throws strikes and is very at hietic. He's also at wo way guy, can play in leftfield and and 3B. We expect him to become a weekend starter as a sophomore."
